The third Government Legislation Programme of the Partnership Government has been published. The Cabinet has approved 31 new Bills for priority publication by July 2017. There are 33 Bills undergoing Pre-Legislative Stage. 27 Bills are currently before the Oireachtas and 69 other proposed Bills are being considered for introduction in the long-term.
